




HOMECOMING









After finishing 8th at the State meet last year and losing several senior key runners, the ladies had a hard time coordinating their efforts although the potential was there. This year's senior co-captains Jodi Janosek and Debbie Mendelsohn ran well, as did Sophomore Nancy Fitz who set the school record in the 5000 meters. Plagued with injuries of one kind or another, the girls made their way through the season. Finally, at the Sectional meet, they all ran to their potential and placed first ahead of rival Kenston. Unlike the boy's team, the ladies' team graduates only two seniors in June, and a strong corp of underclassmen will be returning next year.
















LADY TIGERS ARE NUMBER ONE




















