All their hard work payed off after both CFHS Divers, Peter Natchwey and Austin Penler, as well as many of the swimmers continued on to place at Districts.





Just Keep Swimming




'13est in '13lack

Overall, the team held their ground against hard competitors, placing 3rd at the Grand Valley Duals and 5th at the Panther Invite at Manchester.










In Spanish, a group of students will be taking a trip to Costa Rica. Students on the trip will experience new environments, lifestyles, and customs on their visit.






Social Studies

For many years the Social Studies Department succeeds to teach a mass of information from the past to present. Students also discuss controversial current events happening everyday.




Mathematics
