Exceed herself in any form

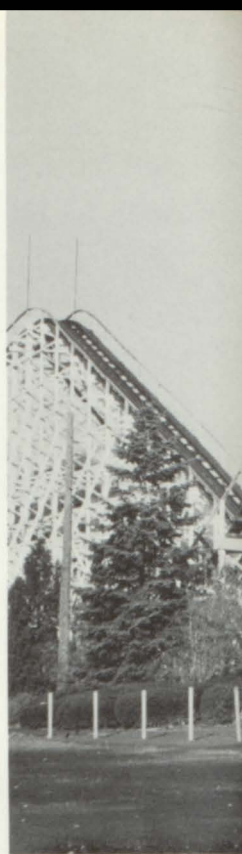

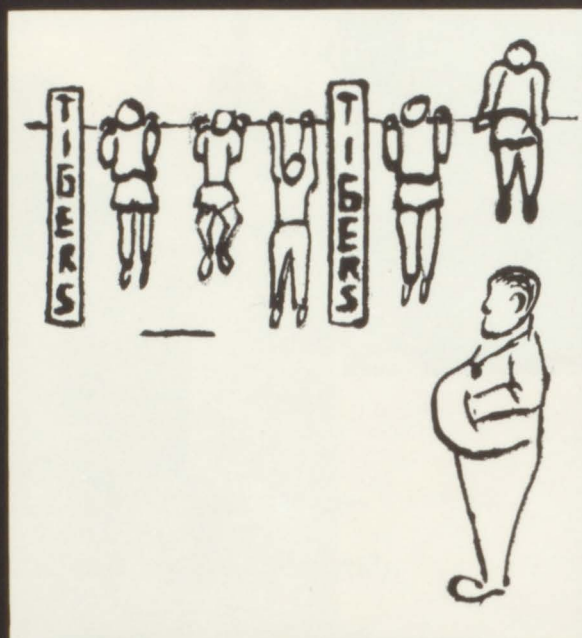
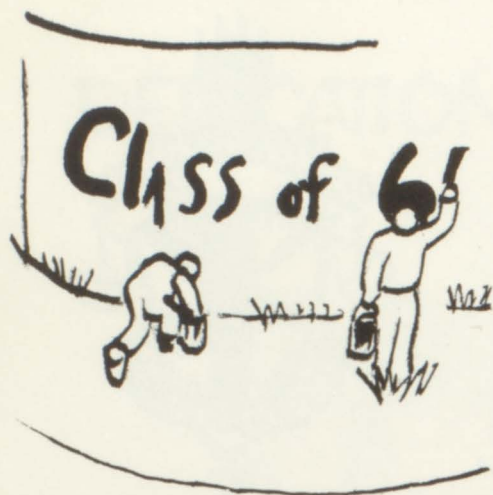
DEDICATION
