
FOREWORD

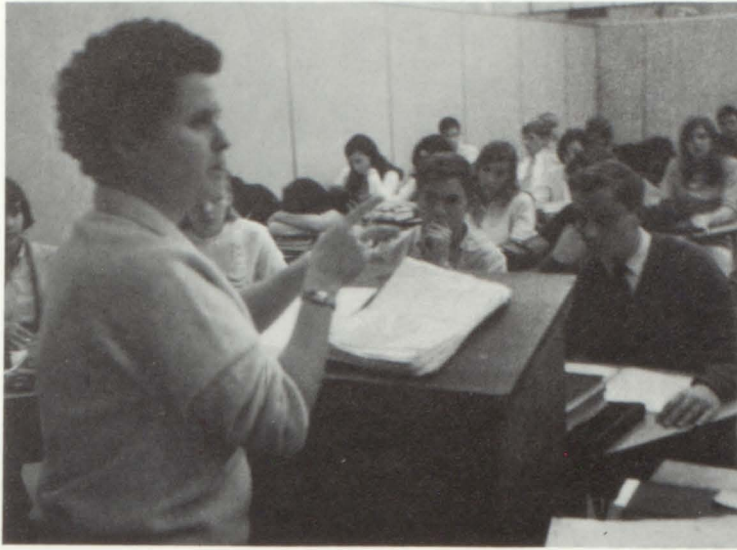


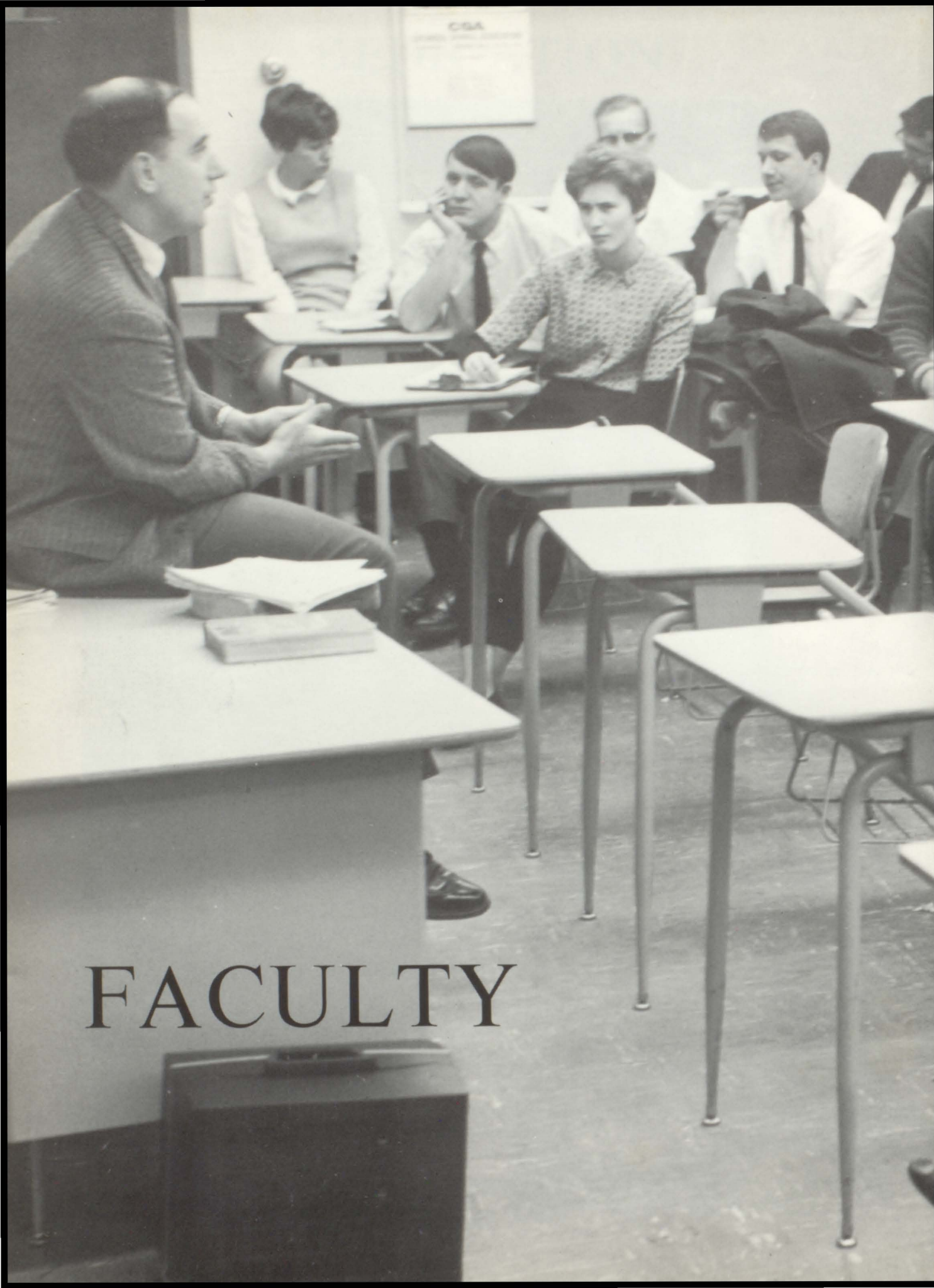
DEDICATION

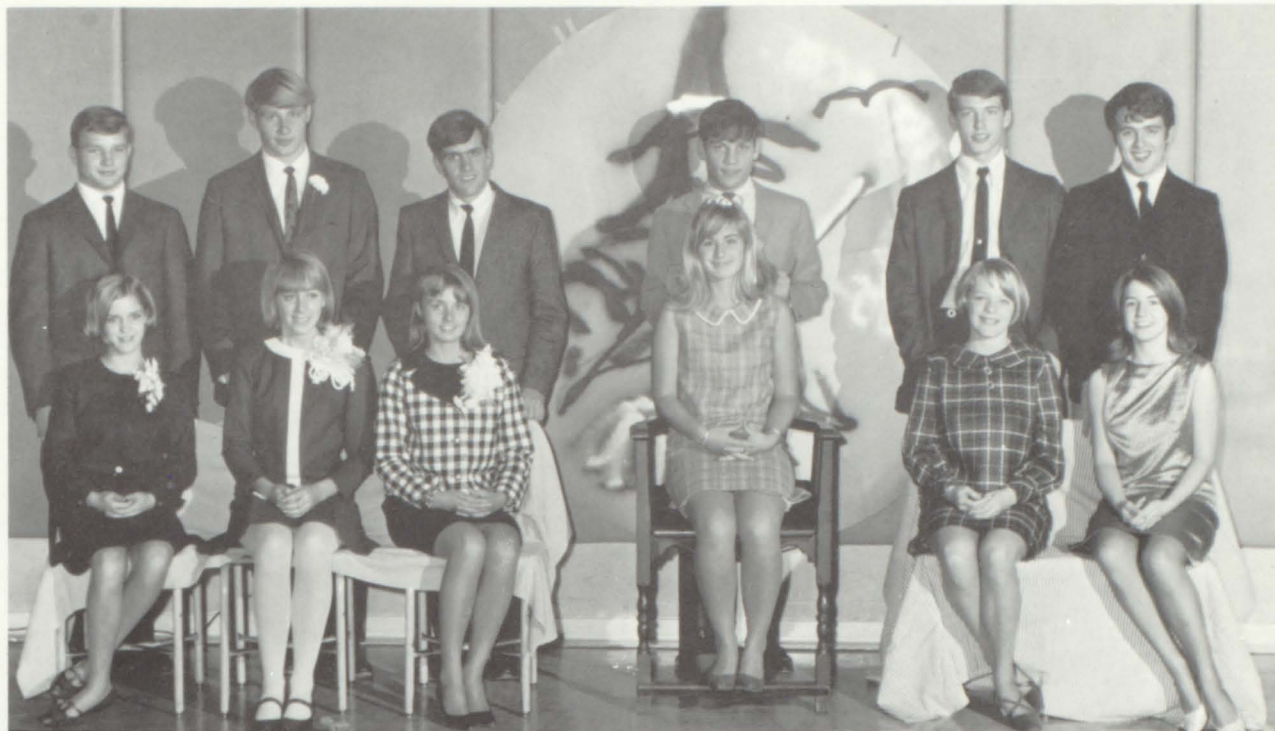

The two impressive victories over Twinsburg (36-0) and Kenston (32-8) showed a great Tiger improvement. Disappointed by a poor showing in their 8-0 loss against Solon, Chagrin bounced back with a hard hitting effort against Orange; but the league champs proved too much as the Tigers lost 19-0. The loyal fans who stayed through the cold and snow at West Geauga saw Chagrin clinch a tie for second in the CVC with a 14-6 win. The final game of the year saw the Tiger spirit evaporate.
