In mid July the CCBA's began preparing for the upcoming season with organized running once or twice a day. By the time the season began, the team was ready and came out as strong as any team in the state, amassing a seasonal record of 107-1 before the State elimination process. For the first time in his twenty years of coaching, Mr. Hurst, otherwise known as the Knute Rockne of the cross country course, watched his team win the prestigious Malone Invitational and capture the first League Title since 1974. With strong school and community support the cross country team made its way through the season into the State Championship Meet in Columbus, and despite two key injuries, which may have prevented a higher finish, the team ended up 4th out of over 200 AA teams in Ohio.
All in all, the squad performed close to its potential and produced a League MVP, three out of sev. en All League runners, and an All Ohioan in Charles
