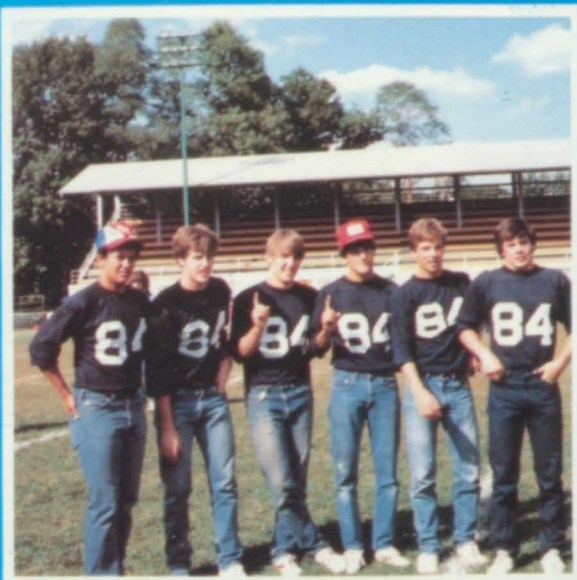

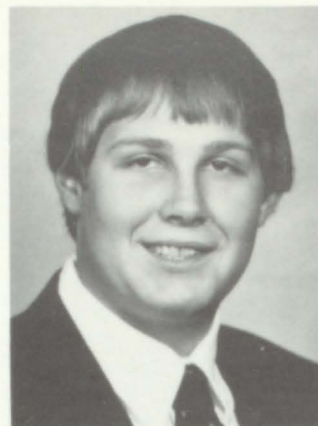

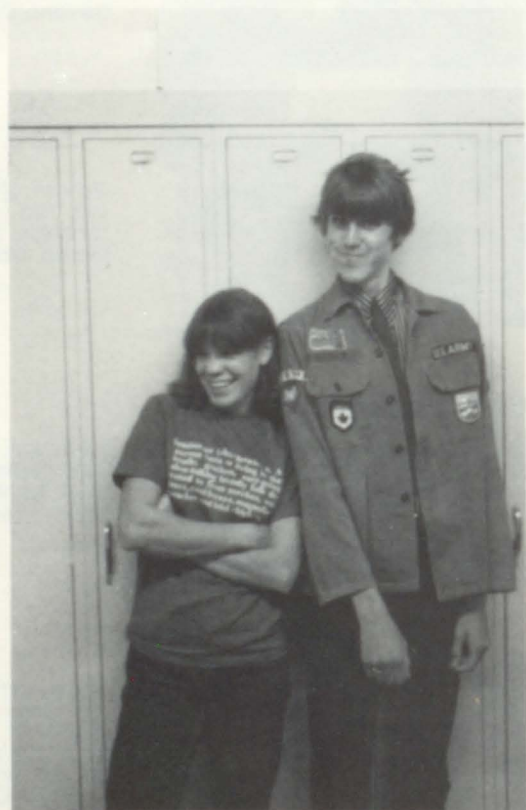

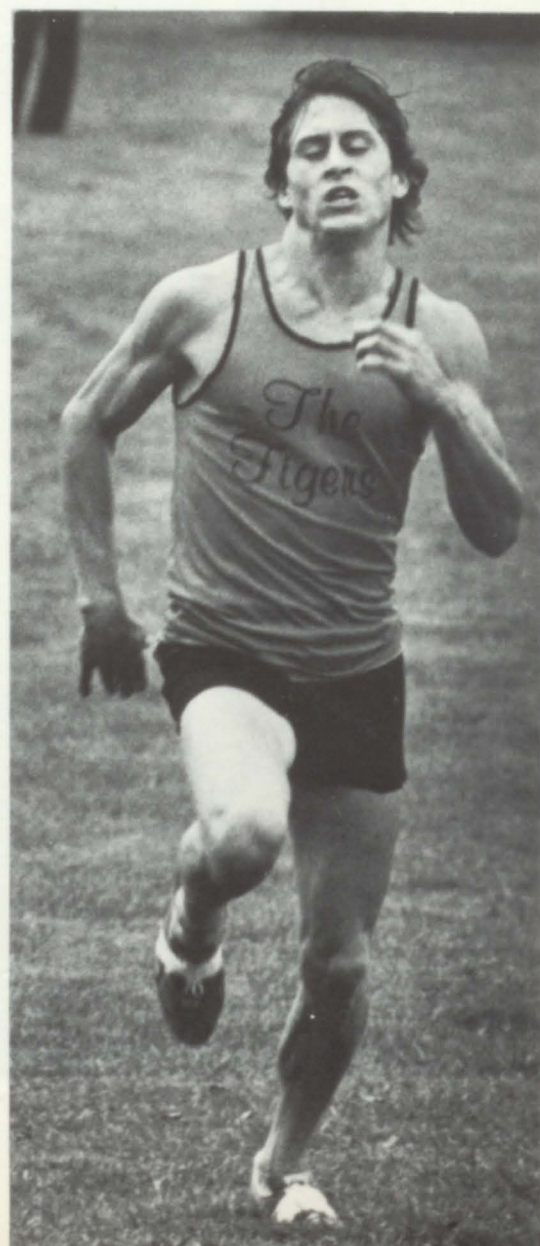

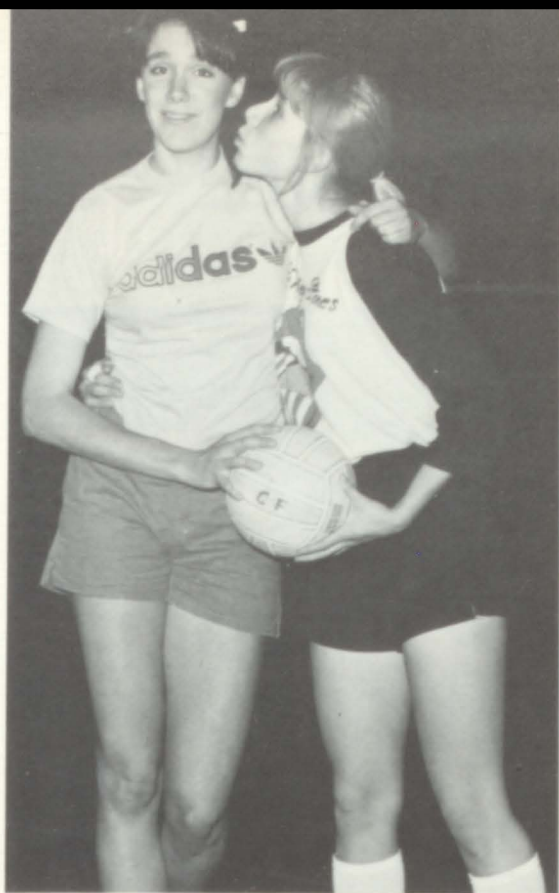

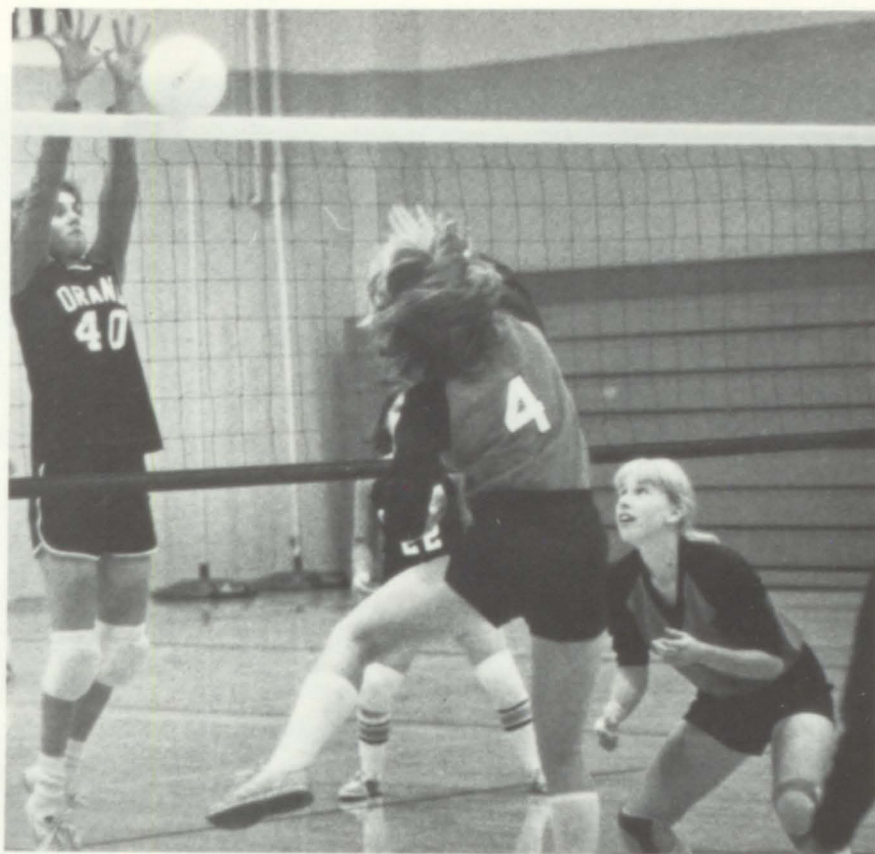

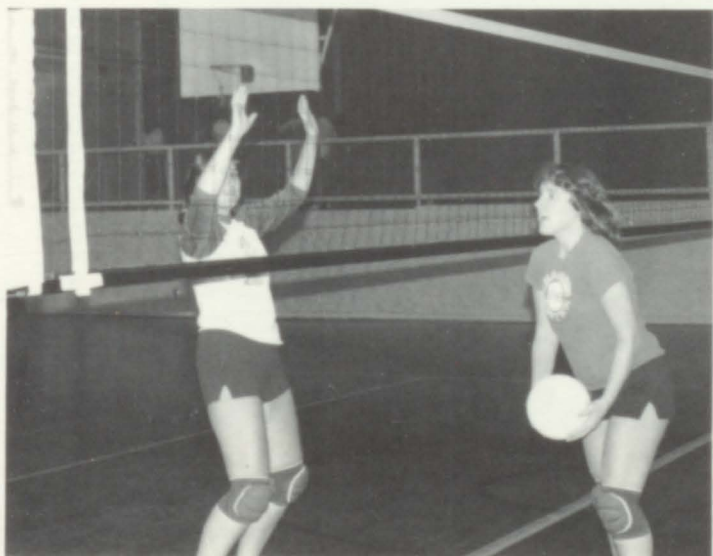

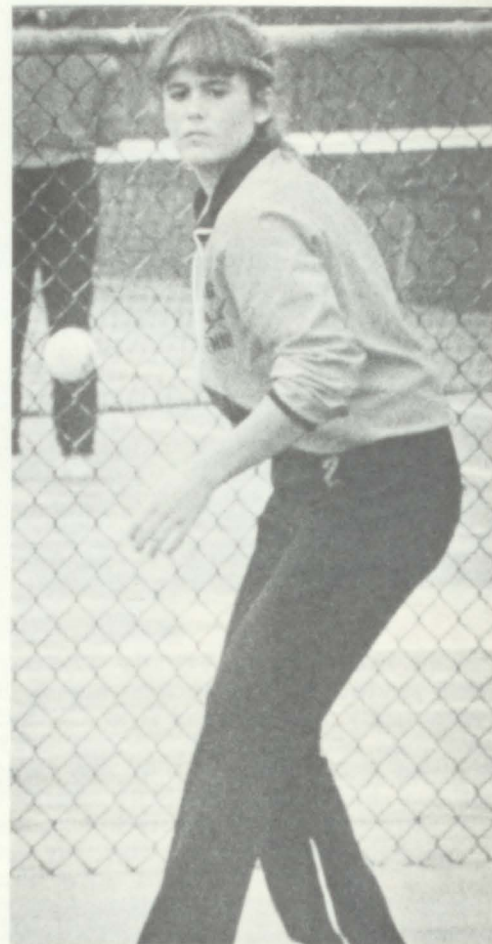

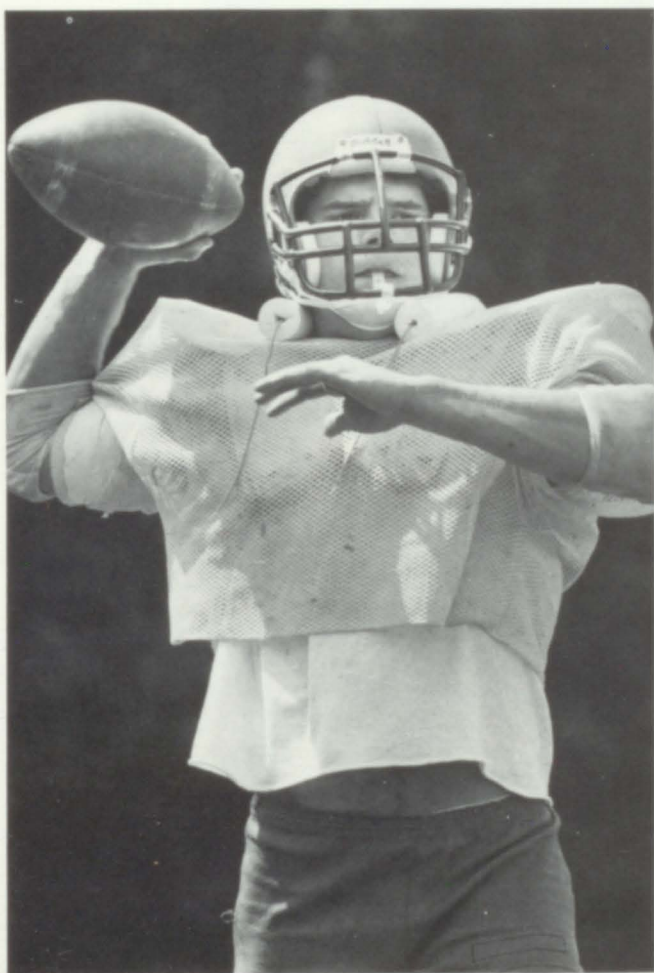

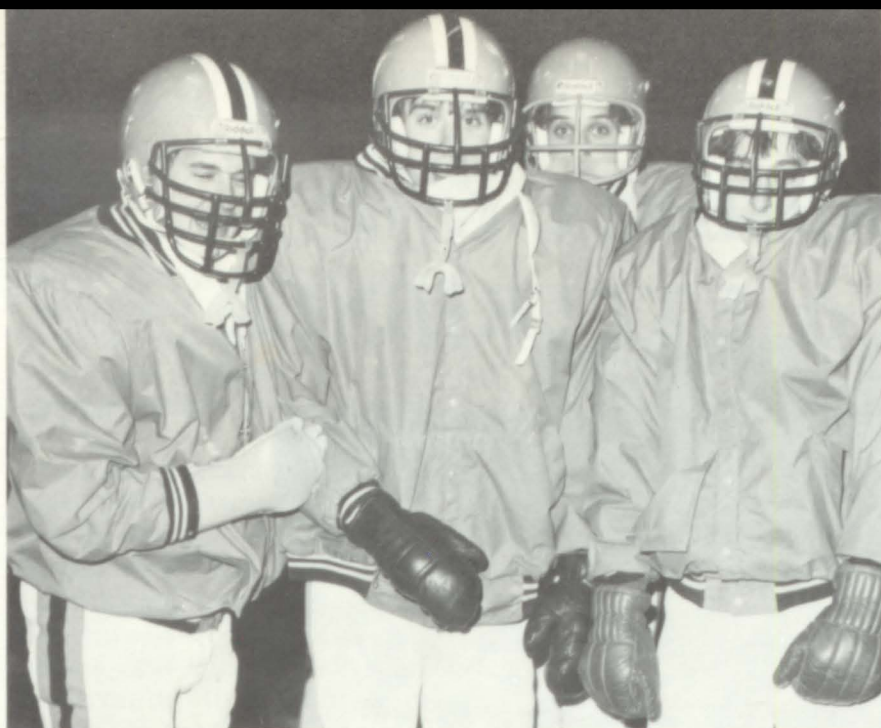

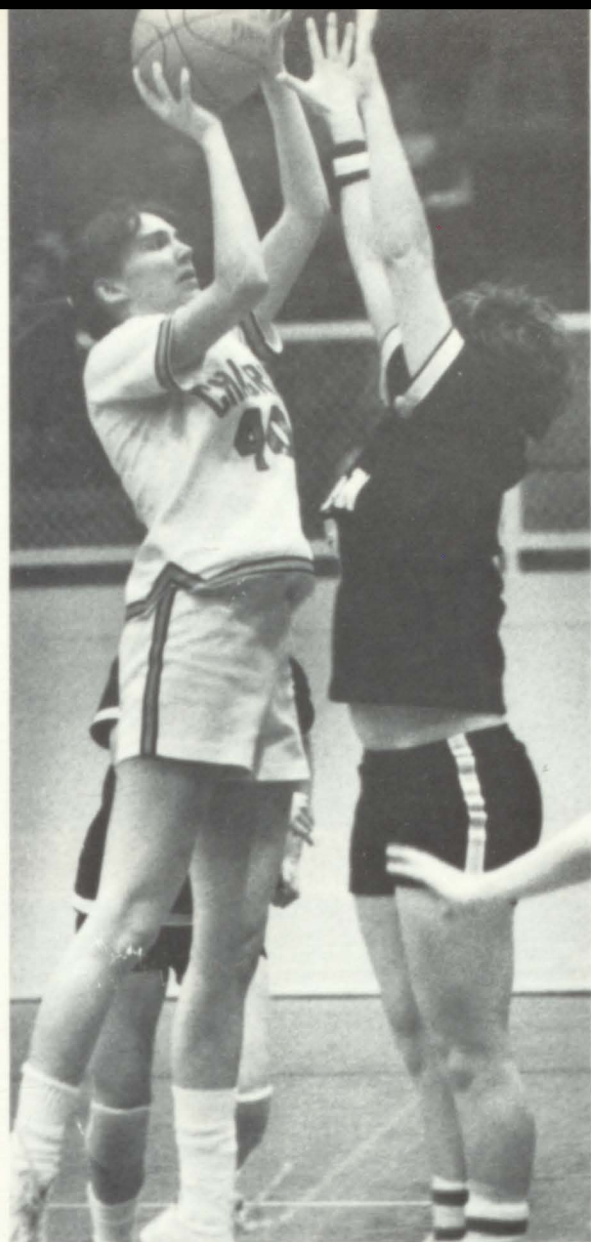
LADY TIGERS ARE NUMBER ONE

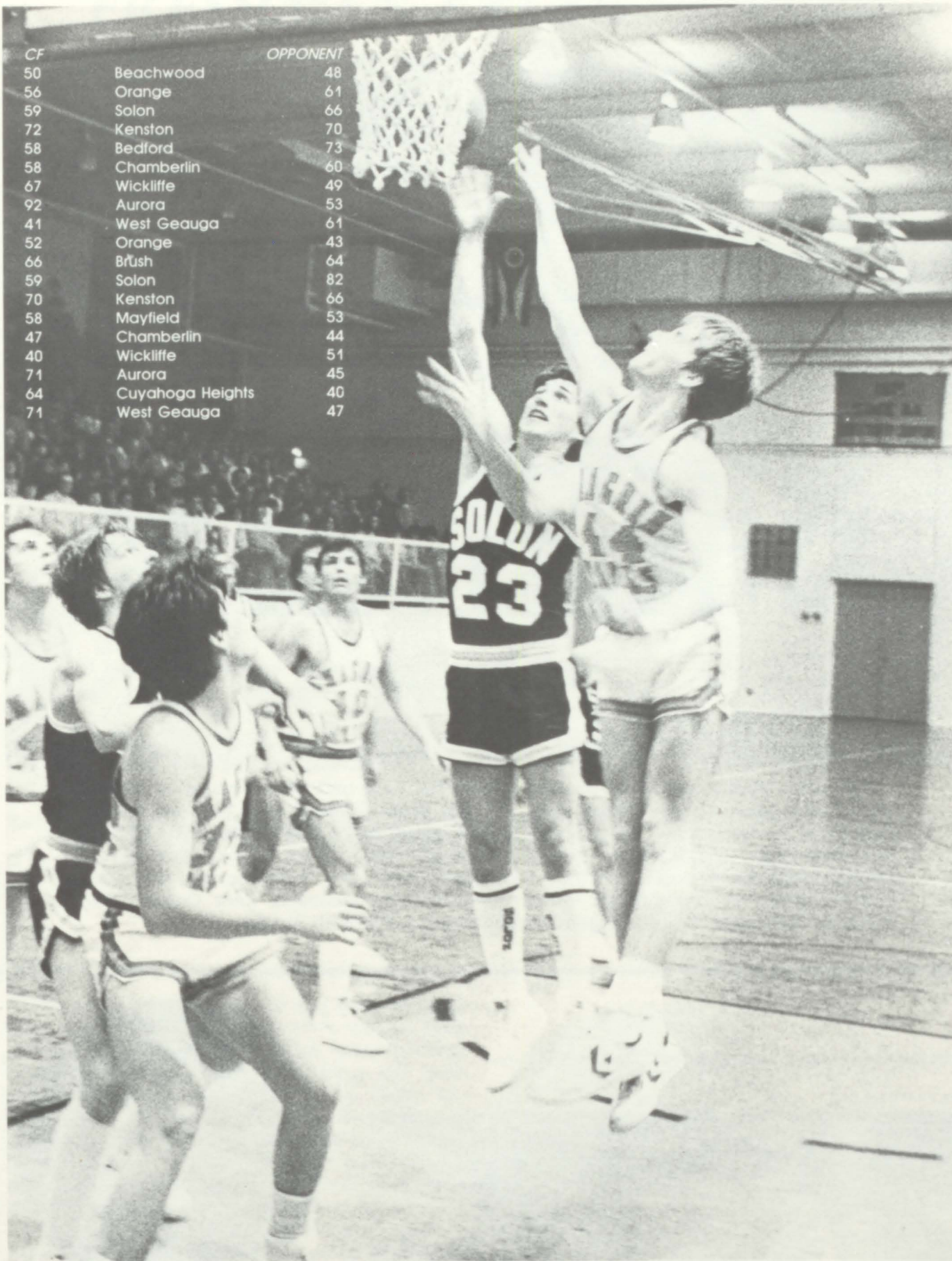

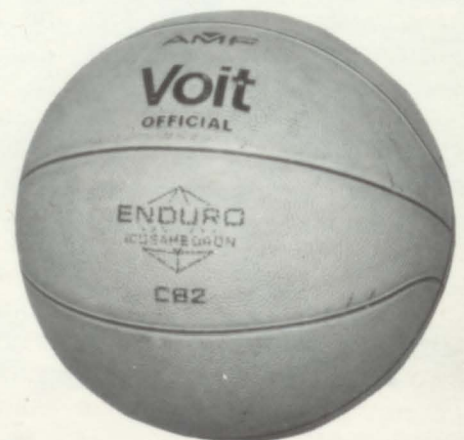



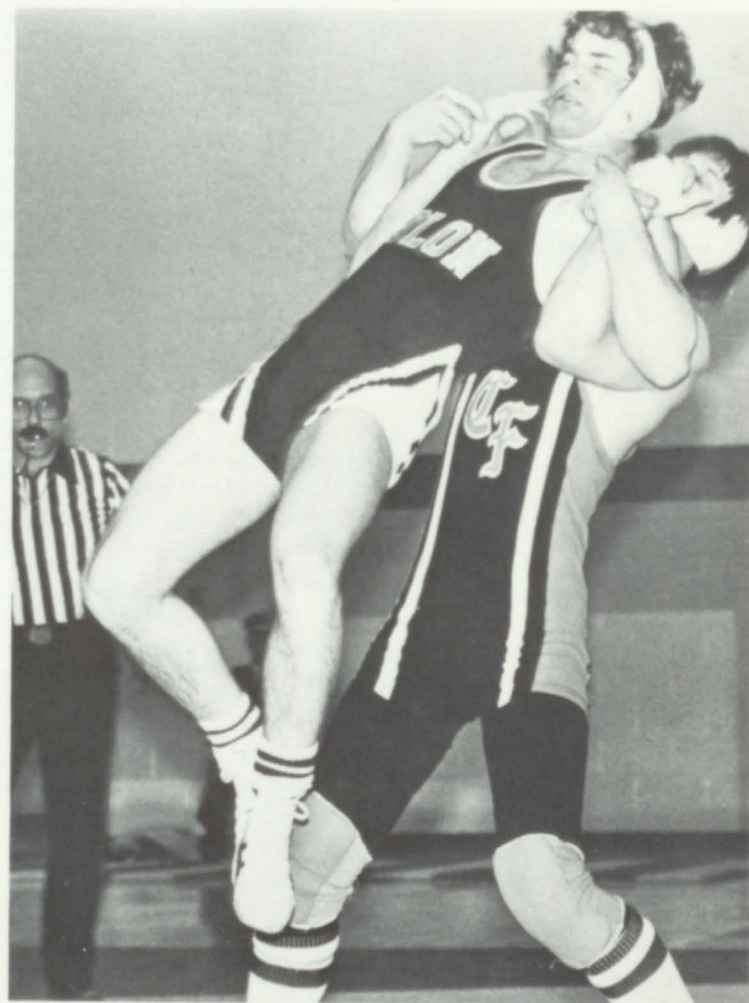

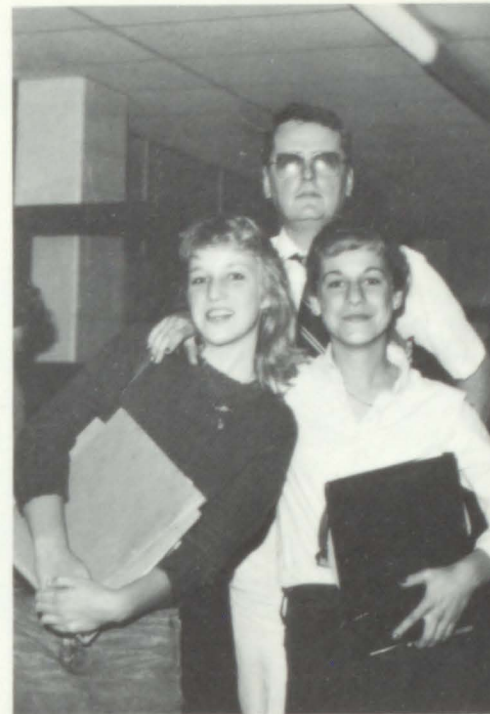

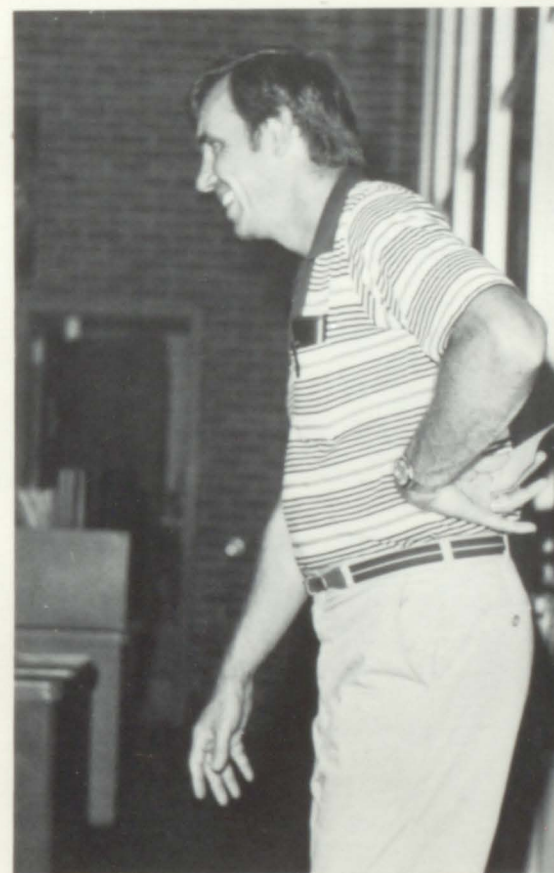

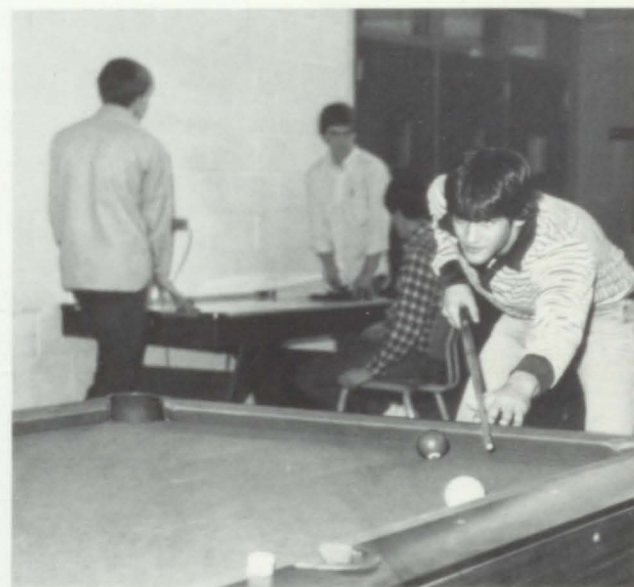
