September greeted us with a torn up patio and a devastated science wing. We had to negotiate with piles of dirt, dust, noise, and improvised science labs. We toured around construction machinery, building supplies, plumbers, carpenters, electricians, and excavators.Gradually, out of the chaos of construction emerged the school's strikingnew facade and the renaissance of the science wing. We were there to see it happen . . . every single day!

During those agonizingly slow days of construction, our pride was boosted with the National Award for Excellence in Education which honored our school as one of the best in the nation. We were proud, even if some of us didn't want to show it. It made us feel good about our school, and about ourselves.

While changes were going around about us, and we busied ourselves with our studies, and activities, and friends, the world about us was being transformed in a way that no one would have ever dreamed possible. 1989-1990 would truly be a time for all to remember.

This yearbook has attempted to capture some of those memories of the past school year. As we move upward into the $90^{\prime}$ 's, many of us bound for college, Zenith will always be there to remind us of that remarkable year of growth, change, and pride.


A major cause of concern, grief, and joy this past year has been the seemingly perpetual construction and renovations that are occurring at the high school. When all is said and done, the cost for the construction at the high school alone will exceed 1.4 million dollars and for the entire district, 4.25 million. As Superintendent Arlene Reiger fittingly remarked in reference to the numerous delays, "We cannot spend 4.25 million dollars wisely in three months."
The construction to the
high school basically involved three genaral areas: The grandstand, the forer and the science wing. In the original timetable, the science wing was to have been completed by the opening of the school year in August, of 1989, but due to delays regarding permits in Columbus, actual work did not begin until July and August. As for the grandstand, again, it was to be completed in the summer in order to be ready for the football season, but delays with permits also impeded its progress. The science wing was to be completed during the summer and into the fall, but those nasty delays struck once again, and it finally was completed in early February. Principal Dr. Trusso's hopes to have all of the construction completed by the end of the first semaster so that the seniors could enjoy the last semester of the senior

year construction-free, were basically realized as the science wing opened in early February.

Perhaps the biggest part of the renovations was the updating of the science wing. These renovations were the most time-consuming and extensive. The entire wing was torn out, and new lab equipment and facilities was installed. The Chemistry lab was relocated and the Biology lab was also renovated. A new science research library was constructed and the offices were carpeted and
relocated in the old Bio room with this libray.

The grandstand phase of the construction basically gave the old stadium a facelift. Construedion workers sandblasted the old paint off and rebuilt the worn areas of the stadium. Several coats of paint were then applied and the stadium was ready for the third week of the season.
The other major phase of the removations consisted of the construetimon of a new foyer, an outside patio area, and a turnaround.

Although the renovations to the high school have seemed to take forever and were a hardship to all, the changes to the high school will be appreciated. It will be a welcome change to the building that we students spend $25 \%$ of our lives in.

In the fall of 1988, our school submitted a thirty page report prepared by the students, staff, and the community to become recognized as one of the finest schools in the country. This entry was then sent to the State Department of Education as the first step towards national recognition. Chagrin Falls High School was then selected as one of the twenty-three schools for outstanding achievement by the state of Ohio, and our application went to Washington D.C. for consideration for national recognition. In the spring of 1989, the $\mathrm{Na}-$ tional Department of Education selected Chagrin Falls High School out of several thousand nominations to be a candidate for excellence in education. A national review panel was sent to study ${ }^{\circ}$ Chagrin and find out if the school excelled in areas such as leadership, teaching and Iearning environments, institutional vitality, and parent and community support.
On May 8, 1989, Chagrin Falls High School was notified that it was selected as one of 218 schools to be recognized nationally in the fall of 1989, at Washington D.C. Out of the 218 schools selected, 176 were public and 42 were private schools. Only $35 \%$ of these schools were selected for national recognition, and only six schools were from Ohio.

With this award, three high school representatives were sent to accept the award in Washington. The representatives were, Mr. Ohlrich, high school math teacher; Liz Youngberg, student council president; and Dr. James Trusso, high school principal.

As an additional recognition, Ohio's First Lady, Dagmar Celeste, came to award the students at Chagrin on Monday December 10, 1989, in the gym. Through the snow, Mrs. Celeste awarded the student body and faculty with a plaque and flag.Both of these awards are displayed at school. Along with the First Lady, Chagrin's School Board and the mayors and officials of the municipalities which comprise the district attended the ceremony. Students at Chagrin were also awarded with a day at the Movies. The morning started off with breakfast for the Juniors and Seniors and then the whole school went to the Chagrin Cinema 6. the Freshman and Sophomores saw Back to the Future II, and the. Juniors and Seniors saw National Lampoon's Christmas Vacation. The day ended at eleven and the students were released for winter break.

Homecoming is always the biggest weekend of the year. 1989 proved to be no different. The activities of the weekend commenced Thursday with the parade, pep rally, and bonfire. The bonfire sparkled up the autumn night as it was one of the largest ever. (It burned until Saturday morning.)

A question that has become an issue this year has been Chagrin's involvement is the CVC. The question arises if Chagrin should stay in the league or join the Metropolitian Athletic Conference, a league of schools that are more Chagrin's size. This solution would appease those who feel that our athletes face ser-
ious injuries if we continue to play against schools like Solon that are twice our size. This proposal would also satisfy those coaches and parents that of other sports teams that want to stay in the CVC.

But our participation in the CVC does not stop at the athletic teams. Many other groups in our school participate in CVC events and activities. Such groups include the band, the choir, student council, and the Academic Challenge team. Thus, the question arises: If Chagrin were to leave the CVC in the athletic capacity, would we leave in other capacities as well, or would those groups continue to participate in CVC events? Or would we cease participation entirely? These and other questions need to be answered in order to find a so lution to this issue

Clubs and organizations at Chagrin provide an integral part of student life. Students are presented with an opportunity to break the classroom routine and exercise the need to be dynamic, competitive, and independent. At Chagrin, 350 students out of 452 participate in the clubs and organizations provided.
Along with being a major part of student academics, involvement in clubs offers a variety of views to their members. One such view is that of our press and our rights as citizens in the United States.
The clubs that achieve this goal are Tiger Times, Zenith, and Debate/Speech. In these clubs, students learn to express themselves, and they learn how far their expression can go. The Tiger Times, and Zenith, show students how to exercise freedom of the press and its responsibilities, while Speech/Debate teaches the students freedom of speech and what that freedom means.
Foreign language clubs are another aspect of school life. In these clubs the students learn how to use what they have learned in the classroom and apply it to life in the real world. Conversations in a foreign language outside the classroom better perepares the student in that language. The foreign language clubs also show students what life in other countries is really like, not the fairy

Other clubs at Chagrin Falls like P.A. Announcer's, Library Aides, and Office Aides, provide students with first- hand experience on how the school is run. The students learn what life behind the scenes at C.F.H.S. is really all about while providing useful, and beneficial services to the school

Clubs in our school also provide the students with leadership skills they may use in their careers.
