These students, many of whom give up their opportunity to sleep in on weekends, deserve to be commended for their abilities to manage a work schedule on top of school work, and occasionally sports practices. In a recent survey of all grades in the high school, in which students were asked if they had a job or if they would like to have a job, the numbers showed that sixteen percent of the freshman class have jobs. Of those who don't work, $58 \%$ wish that they did work. Ten percent of sophomores work, and $50 \%$ would like to work. Of the juniors, $38 \%$ have a job and $50 \%$ would like to find ajob. While $68 \%$ of the senior class hold jobs, eight percent say they are looking for a job. Undoubt-
