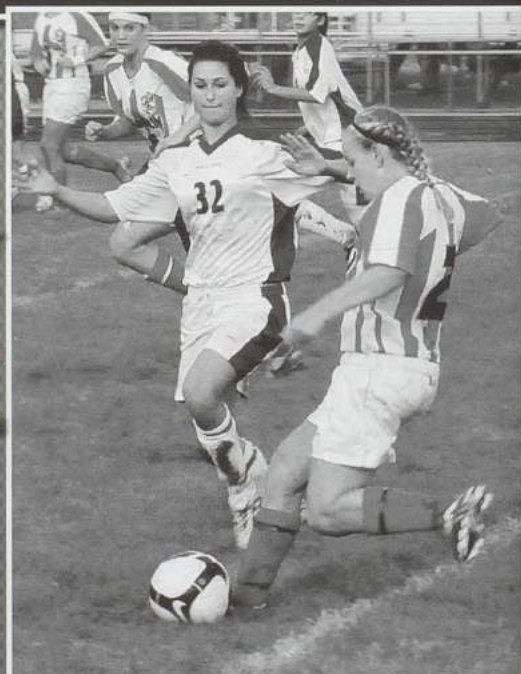

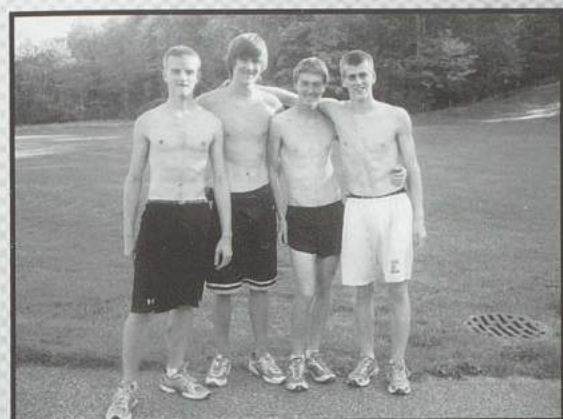

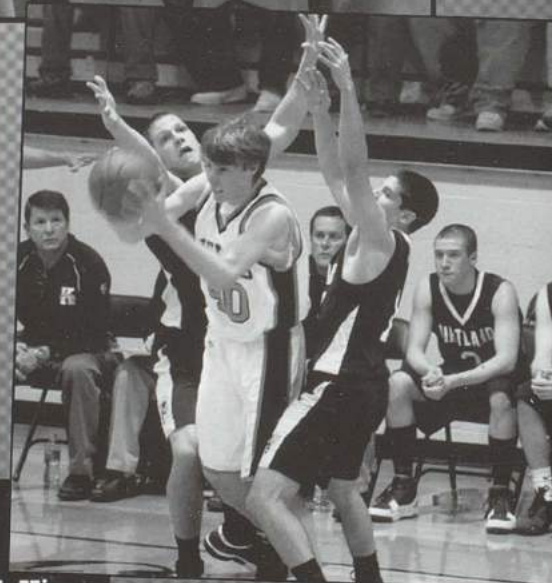

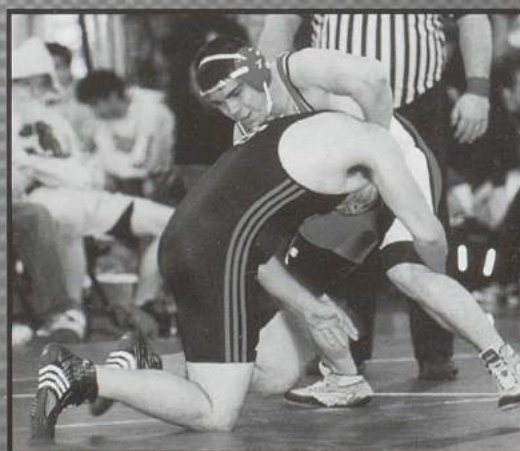
WRESTLING

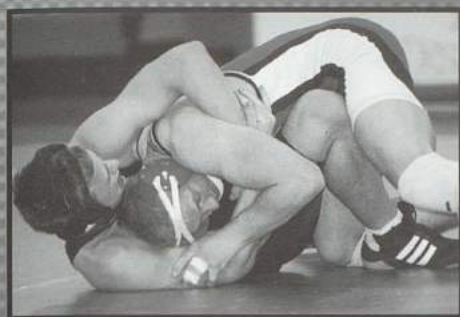

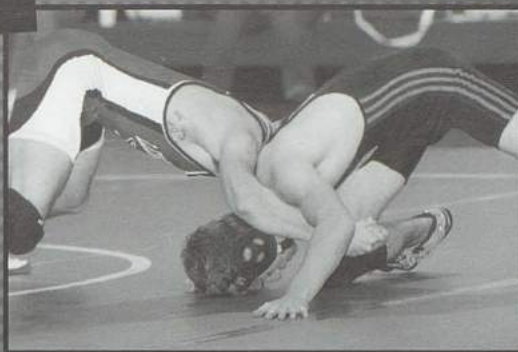

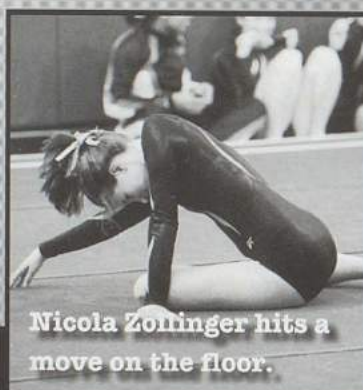

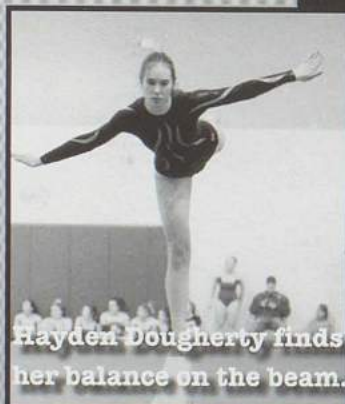

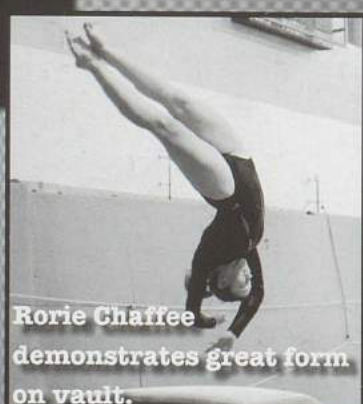

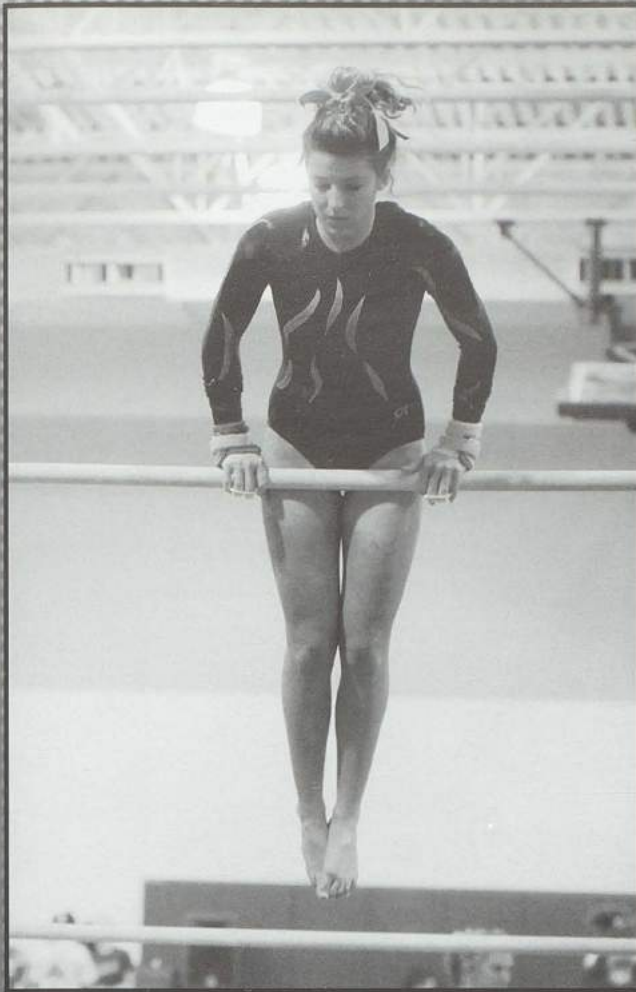

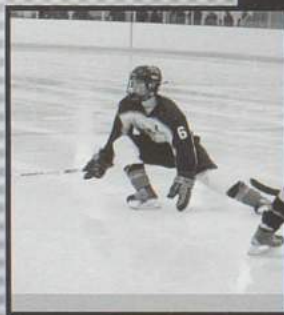

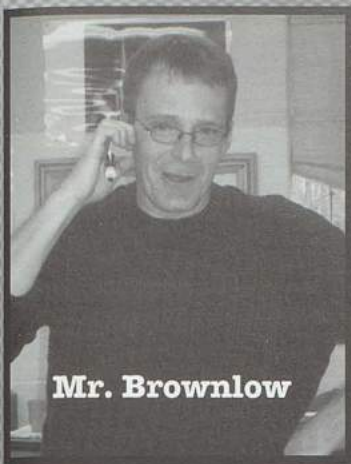

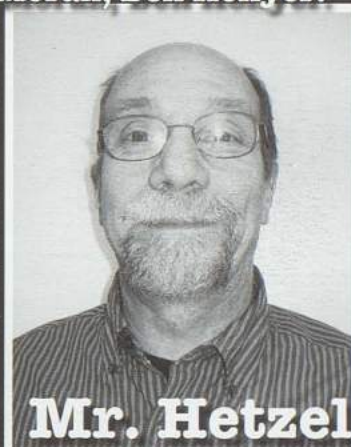
The Art department has had
